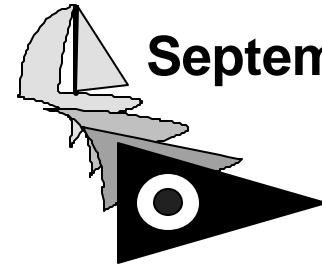

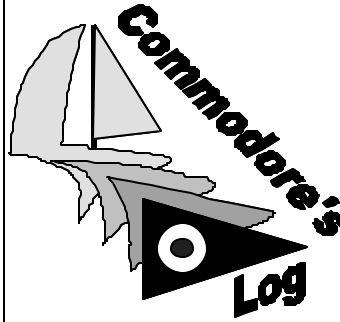
I am planning a Soup Cook-off, so we are looking for several members to join as contestant cooks and the Club members will be the judges. Please let me know if you are interested in sharing your favorite soup recipe with the club.

Mike and Barbara Ehnert, and I put on a Wine Tasting with the help of Jack and Jacki Leahy and many others. The Wine Tasting was attended by around 30 members. We all tasted six different wines (Kenwood Chardonnay Yulupa, Glen Ellen White Zinfandel, Blackstone California Merlot, Forest Glen Forest Fire Merlot; the mystery wine, Pighin Pinot Grigio, and Croft Tawny port) and scored them. I have summarized the scores below:

| Winery/Wine                    | Rating/Stock |

| Kenwood Chardonnay Yulupa      | 5.3          |
| Glen Ellen White Zinfandel     | 3.5          |
| Blackstone California Merlot   | 7.0          |
| Forest Glen Forest Fire Merlot | 4.6          |
| Pighin Pinot Grigio            | 6.3          |
| Croft Tawny port               | 8.1          |

After the tasting the attendees were given the opportunity to taste their favorites at \$1.00 per glass.

Given the results of the wine tasting surveys, I have added the Blackstone California Merlot the bar's inventory at \$3.00 per glass. While the Croft Tawny Port was well received, we already have a very good Port in stock in the Sandeman's Founder's Reserve.



I presented the Board's financial supporting data for the dock rate increase at an exciting General Meeting. The membership voted to continue discussion on the topic of rate increases. Please check elsewhere in the Tell Tales for the presentation or look on the

MYC web site. We will be working with several past officers to develop a rate increase proposal. It is clear the club membership needs to address impending dock expenses. Stay tuned.

Please check under the docks for alligators before using the ramp and waterfront. Several have been seen beneath the docks. The Fish & Wildlife continues to hold the alligator as a protected species however the Board will request in writing that the alligator(s) be trapped. Meanwhile look out.

Obligatory hurricane preparatory message:

Again I urge all MYC boaters and especially those members with their boats in MYC slips to prepare for the upcoming hurricane season. Changes to the MYC dock rules several years ago REQUIRE that roller furling headsails and other loose objects like dinghies be removed from your boat when the club is under a hurricane warning. Please plan accordingly. These rules are designed to prevent your boat from trying to sail during a hurricane with disastrous consequences for all.

The new/old 18-foot RC boat is in use and is very helpful. A work party on September 6 will apply a barrier coat (thanks to Jim Edwards), bottom paint and an automatic bilge pump (thanks to John Russell.)



After a busy season of teaching, the MYC fleet of sailboats needs attention during the September 13 work party. I'm looking for some fiberglass repair to hulls, reattaching sails to spars, applying MYC lettering to hulls and sails, tell-tales for a half-dozen sails and three new rudder pins for the Sunfish.

We also need a sail, rudder and dagger board for the third club Laser. About 30 feet of soft 1/4 inch line for outhauls, vang and travelers on various boats would be helpful.

Thanks to Bob Boska for repairing the dagger board and rudder for the second Laser.

We need to replace the floatation bags on the Optimist Pram fleet. Most of them are aged, full of leaks and don't hold air during a class. Any ideas? Tire sealant, spray foam, or gluing foam blocks into the hulls? Six boats, 3 bags each...

The final sailing class of the season has 10 adult students and is going very well. We are using the Snipe, Laser(s), six Sunfish and Richard Robeck's Hunter 146. We're doing special classes for the small boat racers in the Mermaid Regatta.

There's a growing demand for extending the classes for kids and adults. I'm willing as long as we don't try to sail on Nov/Dec/Jan cold front days.

A final note about the Walter Erben Memorial Award. As much as I'm honored by this, I must pay respect to Dave Noble. He was my mentor on the sailing classes and he was the one who really revived the small boat racing at MYC. I'm just trying to fill his large shoes.

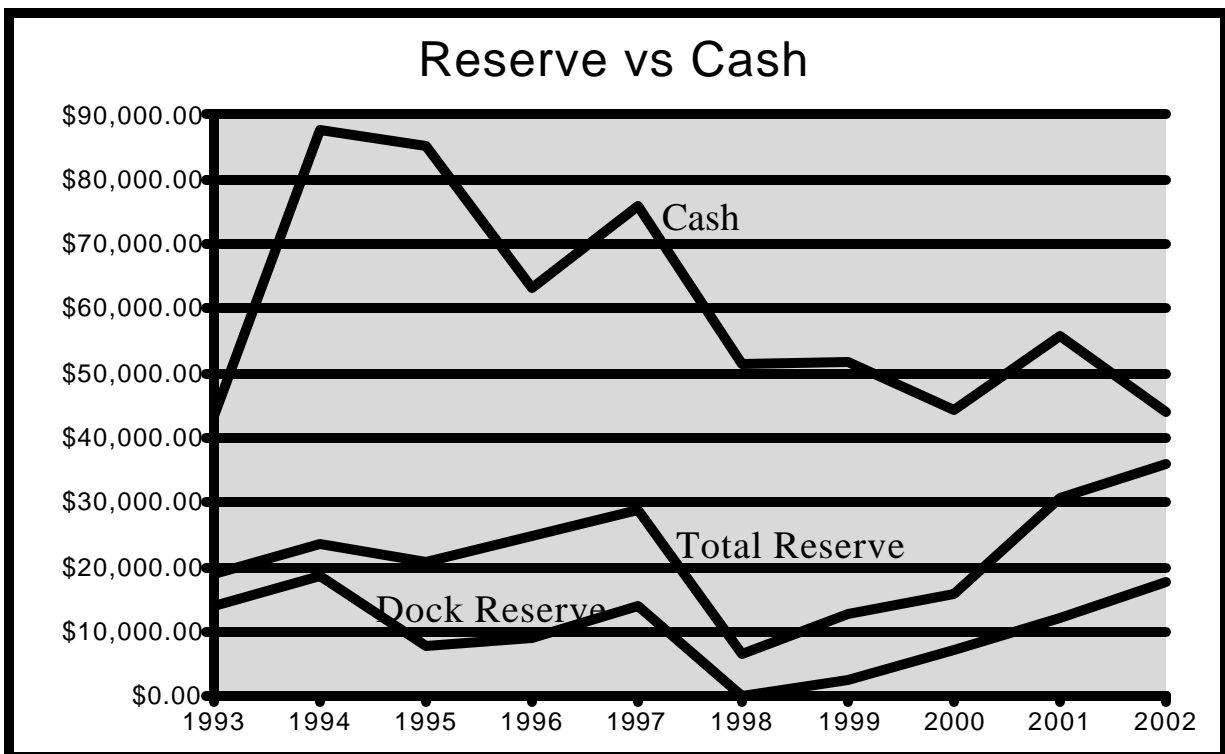

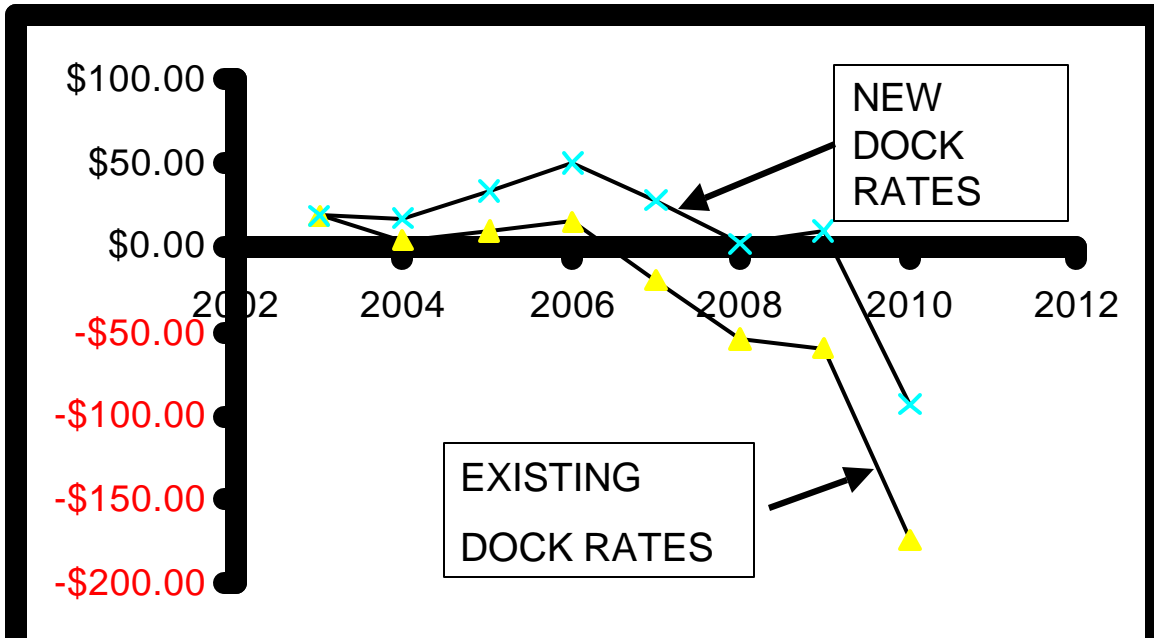

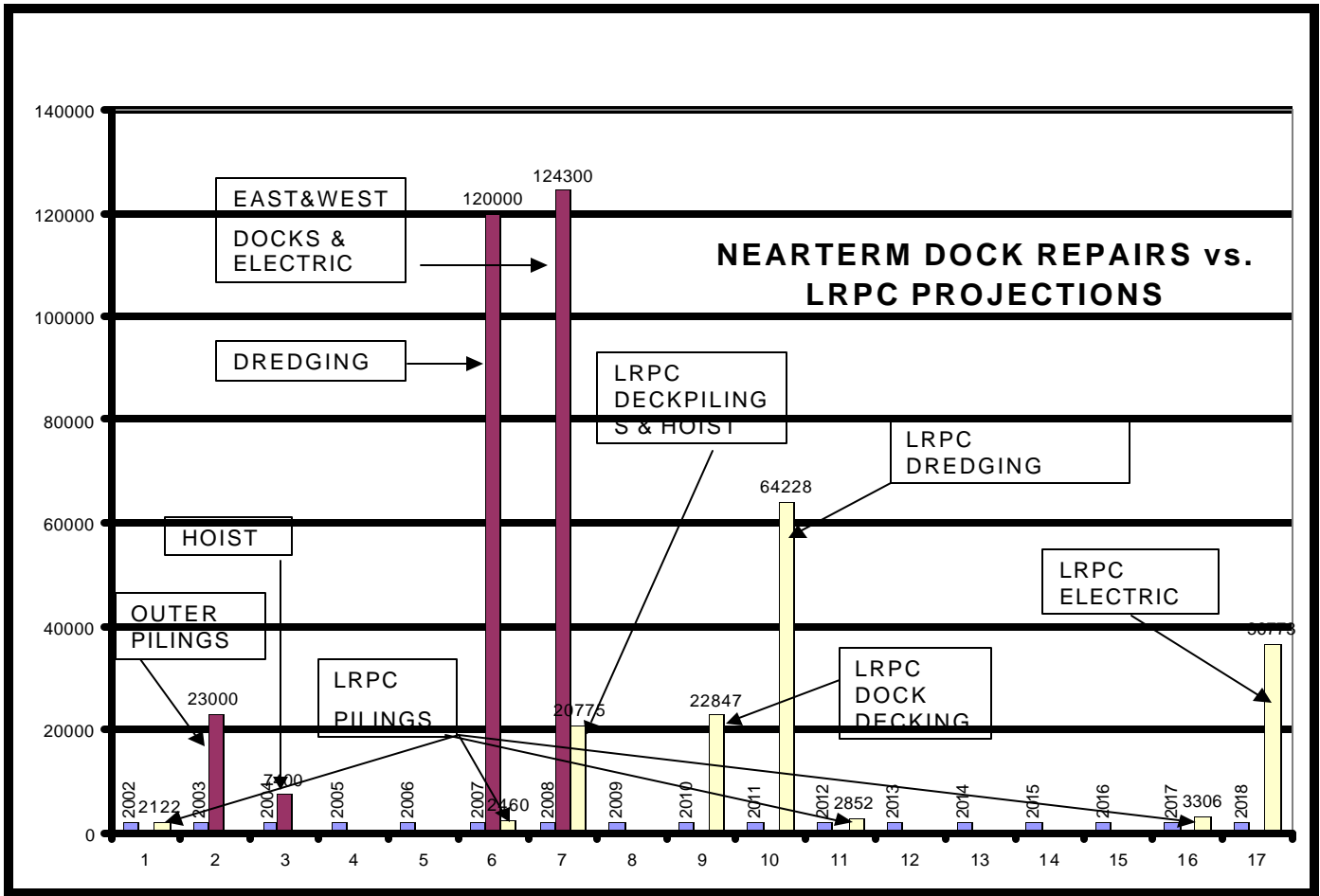

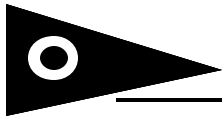
### CPR CLASS

from Mary Williams

I have had quite a few people ask me about updating their CPR certification. 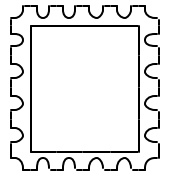
