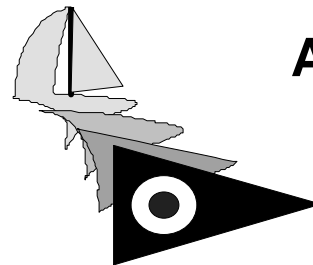

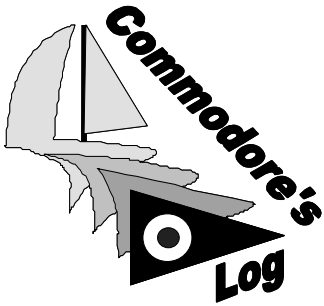

Karl & Susan Kiser's Open Letter on the Great Circle

"Dear Friends at Melbourne Yacht Club,

Karl and I completed our loop or Great Circle trip on *Ariel* in January. We left Melbourne in May of 2004 after removing our mast and rigging, and storing it in our yard. We went up the east coast of the US to the Hudson River, through the Erie Canal and Oswego River. We crossed Lake Ontario, the Trent Severan Canal in Ontario, through Georgian Bay, the Northwest Channel and Lake Huron. We proceeded through Lake Michigan to the Illinois river. Down the Ohio river to the Mississippi river and into the Cumberland river and the Kentucky Lakes. From there we traversed the Tenn Tom Waterway to the Gulf of Mexico. We crossed Florida via the Okeechobee Waterway and back to home. What a wonderful way to see this country; not the usual tourist stops. The trip exceeded our expectations in many ways. It is a long trip but a very interesting one. Anyone interested, please give us a call. *Ariel* has her mast back and she has been sold. We have a new boat; a 35' Albin Command Bridge named *Valentine*. She and we are ready for a Bahamas trip early this summer and the loop again in a couple of years.

Dockmaster Report

1. Web Pages

The club web pages for Docks have been updated to reflect the current storage assignments and waiting list. The new rental agreement form has also been put on the web site. Additional updates will be made shortly to keep up with the rapid changes that are happening.

2. Rental Agreements

The 2006 rental agreements have been sent to all wet storage renters including the A/C questions. To aid in facilitating the process, the agreements were sent with all the available data filled in so that it only requires the renter to validate the information, answer the A/C questions, and sign the form.

To date less than half have been returned so I ask for all wet storage renters to get them back to me as quickly as possible.

I will send out the Dry storage agreements this month and repeat the same process as described above. You will receive a copy filled in to best extent I can with the data available. Please print it out, sign, and return it to the Dockmaster as quickly as you can.

3. Piling Survey

The survey is completed and all the data has been compiled. It is the dock committee's recommendation that 11 pilings be replaced now. One piling still needs to be relocated and a few on the West dock need to be straightened.

I have been in contact with Paul Erickson to perform the work and we are currently meeting to discuss costs and a contract. If all goes well, the current project time frame for the work to be done will be late May or early June. Boats affected by the replacements will need to be moved temporarily for only a day or two. I will be in contact with the affected boat owners as we get a firmer schedule.

Mid-year Dues Assessment Bylaw Amendment Announcement

This is an announcement that a Bylaw amendment has been introduced. This amendment will be discussed, modified, and voted on at the May 3 General Membership meeting.

With the passing of the dues increase bylaw amendment this past March, several members expressed concern that the existing MYC Bylaws do not allow the Treasurer to issue a Mid-year Dues Assessment on the membership. At this time a member's yearly dues are billed in January for the entire year with payment due by February 25. Thus, the opinion is that the Treasurer cannot issue a "mid-year" dues assessment to the membership. Dock rates and the Initiation Fee can change "mid-year", but with the current bylaws the membership dues do not change.

The following is currently proposed text of the amendment:

Reword Article 3, Section 1 as follows:

New member dues shall be pro-rated based upon the percentage of the Club fiscal year remaining when the member is accepted. Pro-rated dues shall be billed in the member's first statement. The retiring Treasurer shall send a statement of Annual Dues to each member prior to February 1st of each year. When the Bylaws are amended mid-year to increase the dues, the Treasurer shall, in the monthly billing cycle following the dues increase, bill the membership for the prorated share of the new dues amount remaining in the Club fiscal year. A member whose dues remain unpaid by ~~February 25th~~ one month after billing shall be assessed a late charge of \$10.00, and shall be sent a second statement ~~by March 1st~~ in the subsequent month. If dues are not paid 30 days from this second notice (March 30th) the member shall no longer be in good standing. The member must then apply, in writing, to the Board of Directors for reinstatement.

Thanks for bearing with us in the schedule adjustment--we are just trying to keep as many people as possible out racing with us.

Friday evening April 7 kicked off the new Rum Race schedule with a fresh southerly breeze. After I write this on Sunday morning (April 9), we're going to sail small boats. There will be no racing on Easter weekend at MYC, but there is an ECSA series race on Saturday. Then we ramp up to Spring Regatta the next two weekends. See the website (<http://www.sail-race.com/myc/springregatta.htm>) and elsewhere in the Telltale for an updated schedule and thanks to Sherry Beckett for keeping the schedule and the website up-to-date. Note that there will be three Friday night races in a row including the Rebel Rally on the Friday night before the big boat weekend of Spring Regatta. The Rebel Rally will be sailed in the Rum Race format but scored separately and not included in the Rum Race series score.

Spring Regatta preparations seem to be coming together. I am very thankful to Rachael Ross who has most of the shore-side activities organized. Thanks to all of you who are helping the Regatta come together. Two sponsors are supporting the Regatta: Boater's Exchange and Kestrel Wind Instruments. The Regatta will start off with a racing rules seminar given by a US Sailing Senior Judge on Thursday April 20, followed by the small boat race on the weekend at Ballard Park. During the Regatta, Snipes will be sailing for their District Championship. There will also be a catamaran fleet. Big boat racing is on the following weekend including the ECSA Cirripedia Cup races on Sunday. Plenty of chances to sail almost anything!

You probably also know that I've proposed a spinnaker racing series using the Rum Race format with adjusted handicaps. I've asked for input and received some thoughtful responses. You can still drop me an email or catch me in the bar and let me know your thoughts and preferences. I hope to talk to more of you as I see you, but based on current input I'm leaning towards Tuesday nights in May and June on weeks without a Rum Race. A mid-week event is the only way to not impact existing MYC races. I'm proposing fair sailing by the rules but no trophies; it's purely a chance to sail with spinnakers together and see where it goes.

Last, but for sure not least, MYC and Sunfish Fleet 669 hosted an awesome Sunfish mid-winters. Lots of people contributed in a million ways. Four days of mostly excellent racing at a great venue on our Indian River Lagoon. Great hospitality by our MYC volunteers provided 74 sailors and their guests a very memorable race.

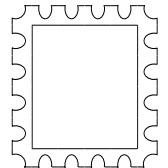
