

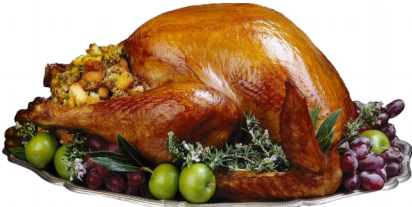

### General Meeting

I would like to thank the Membership who attended the October 6 General Meeting for observing and following the COVID protocol. PLEASE, if you do not feel well, do not attend MYC functions. Do what you need to in order to get well and if it should be the virus quarantine for the directed period of time before getting involved.

At the October General Meeting The following By Law changes were presented. The Board of Directors approved the following proposals for approval to the By Laws

#### By Laws, Article 1, MEMBERSHIP, Section 6

Volunteer work by the membership is essential for the Melbourne Yacht Club's financial, physical, and social wellbeing. Accordingly, all members except Non-Resident, Honorary and Resident Emeritus members will be assessed \$200.00 annually, which can be negated by the number of hours volunteered per member (individually or family) in the previous year. The Six Directors of Committees; Including Bar and Kitchen, Docks, Entertainment, Fleet, House, Membership, and Sailing Education will monitor the hours of the Member(s). Ad Hoc Committees will be monitored by the Commodore or an appointee. 20 hours per year, at the rate of \$10 per hour of Volunteerism, will be credited to the assessment. Joint members will be credited with the cumulative hours worked by the joint members. Members with more than 20 years of cumulative membership in any membership category are exempt from the Assessment. The membership Director will prorate the required hours for members joining the previous year.

By Laws, Article 3, MEMBERSHIP DUES AND FEES, section 1: Due

## Docks / Vice Commodore

Rumors, Rumors, Rumors, the Dock committee cannot act on rumors. If a boat is sold or a member wants to change ownership or leave, MYC Docks must be notified at least by email.

The Dock Director or the committee cannot commence any assignment procedure without being notified. The Dock committee is not going to chase down hearsay and every rumor that circulates in the club. It is the boat owner's responsibility to notify Docks if action is to occur. Just keep in mind any change to the status of

a vessel or its ownership must be reported to the Dock Director.

I recommend everyone read the Wet Slip application and Assignment Rules Section in the directory pages 35 – 39.

Several small boats were moved from the lower parking lot hill to the east yard to make room. I still have an issue with several boat not marked or labeled with the owners name. Marking your small boat with your name helps the Dock Committee keep track of whose boat is where and verify billing for storage.

Due to the recent COVID outbreak and October humidity the dingy rack repair has been rescheduled for the week of November 8. I will need volunteers. Several roof panels will be replaced along with rotted fascia and some painting will be required. It should take a couple of days pacing ourselves. Look for AllMYC emails as the date approaches.

Our electrical breakers on the dock are sensitive. Just about every month I have been called and told “Hey there is no electricity on the east dock or the west dock...”. One hundred percent of the time it is the breaker being tripped. Last year the west dock was reconfigured so that only one section would disconnect where a fault would occur. New wiring was installed when the Docks were replaced during summer 2019. It follows the new code which emphasizes safety. After investigating each incident the cause is usually due to the boat. There was either a boat with a shorting electrical system, rain infiltration into an exposed connection or the latest, and not the first time, an inverter ground fault loop issue. What should a boat owner do when no power is discovered?

1. Check the breaker. There are several breaker boxes on each dock. You will have to locate the one that controls your slip.
2. Investigate the cause. If it is determined that your boat caused the trip, fix the issue.
3. If you cannot determine the cause, contact the Dock Committee.
4. The dock committee will investigate it. If it cannot be resolve to reasonable satisfaction, an electrical contractor will be called in.

Well enough said this month. Have fun out on the water and keep safe.

# Entertainment



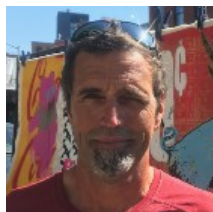

... from Daniel (D.J.) Hazebrook, Lockmaster, Canaveral Lock

Just a reminder. We had a recent incident with #8 and want everyone to be aware.

Unsafe and/or Prohibited Vessels at IMTS-USACE Navigational Locks.

1. Vessels with a visible list.
2. Overloaded vessels
3. Vessels with open flames, grills, active chipping, grinding or welding or any spark producing activity.
4. Vessels leaking cargo.

5. Vessels taking on water.
6. Vessels over 10ft draft.
7. Vessels with open flammable materials.
8. Vessels dragging anchor or chain.
9. Vessels discharging waste or oily bilge water
10. Vessels with overhanging or protruding or projections which can snag or damage lock gates or walls.
11. Vessels actively engaged in painting.
12. Stand on jet skis, paddle boards or similar other vessels without seats.
13. Vessels without proper lines to tie off.
14. Vessels who do not follow the instructions of the lock operator on duty.
15. Vessels having any passengers, legs or arms outside the gunwales or lifelines.
16. Vessels without PFD's for all persons on board.
17. Any vessel deemed unsafe or with operator or crew deemed unsafe by lock operator on duty.

The safety of all and the protection of property and continuing operations is our mission.
